* Types of internship:

- Research internship: conducting research-related tasks for organisations and/or researchers internal or external to the
 University. Tasks vary but may include study design, participant recruitment, data collection and analysis and reporting
 findings. Depending on the research, it may be completed face-to-face or remotely/externally; students may complete a
 minimum number of hours/days depending on the course, could be from several weeks to months.
- Practical workplace internship: undertaking hand-on tasks that enable development of employability skills and
 application of degree knowledge in a not-for-profit, university, government, non-government organisation or industry.
 The internship is likely to be face-to-face, but depending on the nature of the tasks and the student's study area, there
 may be scope for some remote/external work; students complete a minimum number of hours/days depending on the
 course, could be from several weeks to months.
- Short-term project: where interns complete a set project that has agreed desired outcomes and deliverables.

 Depending on the project, it may be completed face-to-face or virtually/remotely/externally; students complete a minimum number of hours/days depending on the course, could e.g. be a 100 hrs.)
